Writing a competitive MSCA Postdoctoral Fellowship

BACKGROUND

This training addresses future applicants and will teach them with a hands-on approach how to write a competitive MSCA PF proposal. The training will put applicants in a good position to write a strong and successful MSCA PF proposal. This is very much needed due to the competitive nature of the program.

Ongoing support to the applicants during the proposal preparation is important. Therefore, we invite support staff and supervisors to participate in the training.

PROGRAMME

The training provides participants with a thorough understanding of the program, its rules and of the expected impacts. The training discusses all parts of the proposal template, as well as topics that underlie these parts, such as an introduction to Impact and Career Development. Throughout the training, we refer to and explain the 3 evaluation criteria as a guiding principle. We provide examples, and we challenge the participants to reflect on their own skills and expertise and plans. The training set-up complies with the GDPR.

METHODOLOGY

The training will be offered as an interactive e-learning training, and will take place through our e-learning platform MSCA Academy (hosted on moodlecloud). Participants will get access through individual access keys, and will receive information on how to use the platform. They will have access to the platform until the day after the call deadline. Specific dates for Group Work and wrap-up session will be agreed with the host organisation.

Each training will be offered to participants from one single host organisation. This allows participants to take part freely and for support staff to contribute.

The training has the following elements:

- ~15 video lectures (~3h45) (short videos in which we explain how
 to prepare the writing of the proposal, and how to write the
 different parts of the proposal).
- Participation in 2 interactive group work exercises with up to 13 people, and in a final interactive wrap-up session for the entire group, support staff and trainer.
- Opportunity to ask questions to the trainer, leading to a FAQ that will be published on the e-learning platform.
- Support material will be provided on the platform, including a
 Proposal Outline template. In this document, the participants will
 be able to design the outline of their proposal as we go through
 the different parts of the proposal. After the course, they can
 use the outline as the basis for their proposal.
